College Prep Exams

SAT Exams Dates:

- 10/5 exam (registration deadline 9/20 and late deadline is 9/24)
- 11/2 exam (reg. deadline is 10/18 and late deadline is 10/22)
- 12/7 exam (reg. deadline is 11/22 and late deadline is 11/26)

ACT Exam Dates:

- 10/26 exam (registration deadline is 9/20 and late deadline is 10/7)
- 12/14 exam (reg. deadline is 11/8 and late deadline is 11/22)
- 2/8/25 exam (reg. deadline is 1/3/25 and late deadline is 1/20/25)

*If you need accommodations for any upcoming exams, reach out to me ASAP. Please note that these accommodations must be set up at least 2 months (8 weeks) in advance of any upcoming exam. (The deadlines to apply for accommodations are way before the registration deadlines.) Remember, you must find a location near you to take the exam. You should be able to find a local location on the ACT or SAT registration website.

PSAT/NMSQT Exam & Pre-ACT Exam Information (for freshman, sophomores, and juniors):

The **PSAT/NMSQT exam** will be coming up soon. MOST high schools will be giving this exam during a school day from **Oct. 1-Oct. 31**. (A few schools may also give it on Sat., Oct. 12 or Sat., Oct. 26.)

If you want to take this exam, you will need to call/email/contact in person your local high school to arrange for the counselor to order your test and allow you to take the exam there. Some high schools will make you pay, but the fee is quite nominal, usually around \$15.00. However, many high schools will not charge you at all — so be sure to ask!

You will need to contact the local school within the next week or so to make sure they have enough exams. If you need help with any of this, please let me know. Since the COVID pandemic, many schools may be more reluctant to allow "outside" students to take the exam. In some cases it may be hard to find a place to sit to take the exam. Please note that this exam is NOT REQUIRED and not needed to get into college, so please do not get too upset if you cannot take it this year. If you do not sit to take the PSAT it will not be detrimental to your college admission process.

Most of the time freshman do NOT take this exam, but if you are a 9th grader who would like to try, you are welcome to do so. You can always take it again as a 10th grader (and also your 11th grade year). It is usually suggested that 10th and 11th graders take it. (However, if you have already taken it, you do not have to take it again, unless you think it would help.)

Note: To be eligible to become a National Merit Scholar (which is not something you can really "study for", but is a very high honor), you MUST take the exam either your 10th or 11th grade years. The Pre-ACT exam/s are given in the spring. The testing window this year is March 17-April 25, 2025. You may wish to reach out to your local school if to see if you can sit to test for this next spring.

NHS Eligibility for the 2024-25 School Year:

Sometime in the next week or so a full email will be sent out to all high school students and families regarding how your student can become eligible to apply for National Honor Society this school year. In short, if your student meets these criteria, they will receive an invitation to apply on/around Feb. 1. Here are the main criteria:

- Have an cumulative HS GPA of 3.5 or higher
- Are a sophomore in standing (have completed at least 6 total HS level credits)
- Have attended CMASAS for one semester (this means he/she has completed at least 3 HS-level credits)

ASU Dual Enrollment and AP Course Applications:

Students, if you wish to take an AP course this year (fall, spring, or a full-year course), please note that you must apply to take these courses via our online application form.
